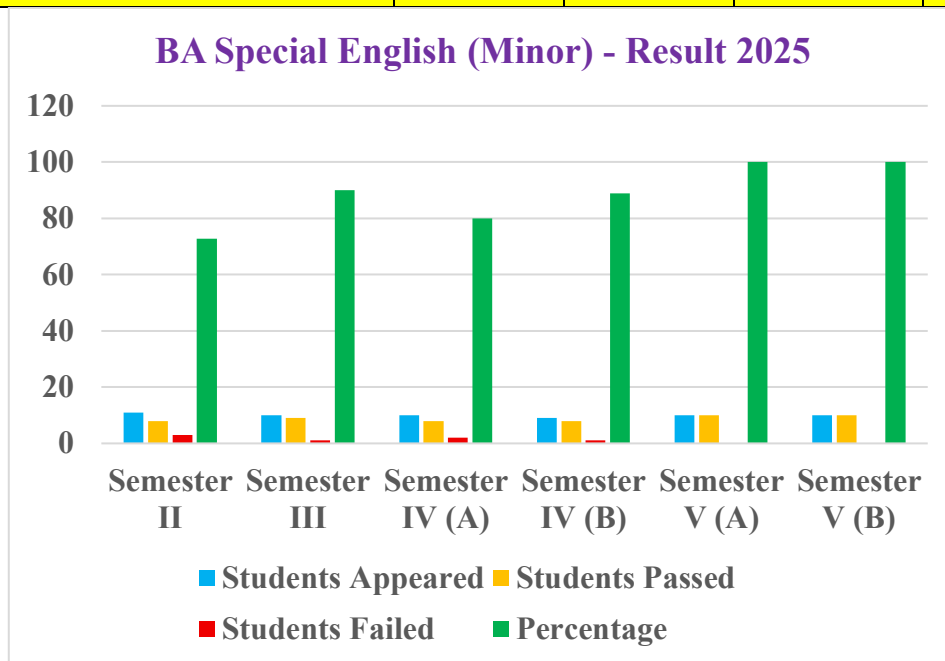

The graphical chart clearly illustrates this upward trend, with the pass percentage increasing gradually and reaching the highest level in the final semester.

- The analysis indicates a clear improvement in student performance across semesters.
- In the II Semester, the pass percentage was 72.7%, indicating moderate performance with a few failures.
- In the III Semester, the pass percentage improved to 90%, showing better student understanding of the subject.

- In the IV Semester, the results were 80% and 88.8% for Papers A and B respectively, indicating stable academic performance.
- In the V Semester, both papers recorded a 100% pass percentage, demonstrating significant academic improvement and mastery of the subject.

#### Key Observations:

- Progressive improvement in pass percentage from II to V semester.
- 100% pass rate achieved in V Semester in both papers.
- Failures decreased significantly over time.
- Students demonstrated better academic engagement and subject comprehension in later semesters.

#### Factors Contributing to Improvement

- The improvement in results may be attributed to:
- Effective teaching-learning practices like Elicitation, ABLT, GDs, TPS, ICT, Peer Teaching & Peer Learning
- Continuous internal assessment
- Remedial classes for slow learners
- Student mentoring and academic guidance
- Increased student participation in classroom discussions and assignments

The result analysis demonstrates steady academic progress among students from Semester II to Semester V. The improvement in pass percentage and the achievement of 100% results in the final semester reflect the effectiveness of the teaching-learning process and academic mentoring provided by the Department of English. Overall, the performance of the students is satisfactory and shows positive academic development.
